Here and Now: Advice for Newbies...

What sage advice would you give to a community just starting to focus on developing a coordinated prevention system based on their current capacity if it is...

- **Low**: no dedicated system staff or funding
- **Moderate**: some dedicated system staff and funding
- **High**: full-time system staff and funding

EXAMPLES of what you can do next:

Starting Where You Are

Low Capacity Community:

No dedicated system staff or funding

- Elevate with CoC and community partners - **prevention is possible.**
- Set a Core Team with 'volunteer' to lead
- Strengthen current diversion & prevention efforts
- Focus on Veterans and existing funding & learning

Moderate Capacity Community:

Some dedicated system staff and/or funding

- Dedicate staff to support for Core Team
- Conduct inflow analysis, heat mapping, interviews
- Pilot standardized screening tool using national templates
- Pilot & grow Housing Problem-Solving (HPS) training, certification

High Capacity Community:

Full-time system staff and funding

- Scale HPS training - training program
- Operationalize Flex Funds for urgent/unmet needs
- Expand and develop Access Points, Service Providers, and cross-sector partners
- Establish prioritization protocols tied to data
